PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934

The Minister of Power hereby gives notice that, in accordance with the provisions of the above Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, as of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, as amended, he has granted to BP Exploration Com-pany Limited, Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London E.C.2, an extension to a licensed area. Details of the licensed area, which covers an area of 121 square miles in the Counties of Buckingham, North-ampton and Oxford were published in the London Gazette of 24th July 1959. Details of the extension, which is in two parts, are given in the Schedule below. The boundaries are described by reference to the 24 inch. Ordnance Survey mans. 21 inch Ordnance Survey maps.

SCHEDULE

Original Licensed Area-121 square miles in the Counties of Buckingham, Northampton and Oxford.

Extension-An area of approximately 69 square miles in the Counties of Oxford, Northampton and Buckingham, in two parts.

First Part. From Banbury Station the boundary follows the railway line generally eastwards via Wark-worth and Greatworth to the railway viaduct just west of Helmdon, whence it follows the railway line southwards to the viaduct just south of Radstone, thence the lane and then the road south-eastwards thence, the lane and then the road south-castwards via Whitfield to Buckingham. From Buckingham the boundary follows the road westwards via Tinge-wick and Croughton to Aynhoe and thence north-west to the Canal Lock just west of Nell Bridge. Thence the boundary follows the Oxford Canal north-west-wards to Banbury and thence the road east across the railway line to Banbury Station.

Second Part. From the road fork just west of Hoggeston the boundary follows the road eastwards via Hoggeston to the cross-roads south of Stewkley, thence the road south-eastwards to the road fork just east of Wing, thence the road south-westwards via Wingmill, Rowsham and Bierton to Aylesbury. From Aylesbury the boundary follows the road generally northwards via Weedon, Hardwick and Whitchurch to the road fork just west of Hoggeston.
