PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of July, 1960, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) for effecting (1) the union of the benefice of Newton Ferrers and the benefice of Revelstoke, and (2) an alteration of the boundaries of the parishes of Brixton, Yealmpton, Newton Ferrers, Revelstoke, Holbeton and Ermington, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Exeter.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Newton Ferrers and the benefice of Revelstoke shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newton Ferrers with Revelstoke' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* both of the said benefices shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect; and if upon that day one only of the said benefices shall be vacant, the union shall take effect upon the first avoidance of the other; and if upon that day neither of the said benefices shall be vacant, the union shall take effect upon the first avoidance of that one of the two benefices which shall last be avoided after that day.

"3. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Revelstoke having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"4. *Alteration of boundaries.* Upon the date when the union takes effect, and with the consents (which have been given to us in writing) of the Reverend Maurice Aldham Paston Comeau, being the incumbent of the benefice of Yealmpton; of the Reverend Philip George Heppenstall, being the incumbent of the benefice of Holbeton; of the Reverend Dennis Samuel Maddocks, being the incumbent of the benefice of Brixton; and of the Reverend Eric George Martin Crocker, being the incumbent of the benefice of Ermington, the boundaries of the parishes of Brixton; Yealmpton; Newton Ferrers; Holbeton; Ermington; and Revelstoke, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto.

"SCHEDULE

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Brixton:

"All that detached part (coloured brown on the map lettered A annexed hereto) of the parish of Yealmpton which is bounded on the southwest by the parish of Wembury and on all the remaining sides by the parish of Brixton.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Yealmpton:

"All that part (coloured green on the map lettered A annexed hereto) of the parish of Newton Ferrers which lies to the northeast of the middle of the road which runs from Creacombe Cross via Ashcombe Hill to Puslinch Bridge, and which is bounded on the north and part of the east by the parish of Yealmpton and on the remainder of the eastern side by a detached part of the parish of Holbeton.

"3. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Newton Ferrers:

"All that part (coloured blue on the map lettered A annexed hereto) of the detached portion of the parish of Holbeton which lies to the southwest of a continuous imaginary line commencing at a point
