*Meriden Rural District Council (Duggins Lane, Berkswell) Public Footpath Extinguishment Order, 1960*

The above Order made on the 13th day of September 1960, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to extinguish the public right of way (part of path No. M.201 on the provisional map prepared under the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949) running from a point approximately 380 yards east of Nailcote House, Berkswell, for about 504 yards in a north-easterly direction to the boundary between the rural district of Meriden and the city of Coventry 190 yards north of Duggins Lane.
