The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (Southwark) (No. 3) Regulations, 1960 (S.I. 1960/1977)

Under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, the Minister of Transport has made regulations, coming into operation on 8th November 1960, which institute one-way traffic working from south-west to north-east in Bartholomew Street, and, prohibit a right-hand turn from New Kent Road into Old Kent Road, Southwark.

Prohibition of Waiting County of Hertford

The Minister of Transport proposes to make Regulations under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, to prohibit waiting by vehicles at all times on the carriageway of the ifollowing lengths of trunk road:

The London—North Orbital Trunk Road (A.405)
Between its junction with the London—Carlisle—
Glasgow Trunk Road (A.6) at London Colney to its junction with the London—Holyhead Trunk Road (A.5).

The London—Carlisle—Glasgow Trunk Road (A.6)
From a point 250 yards south-east of the entrance
to Salisbury Hall, Eletree to a point approximately I' mile south-eastwards.

Exemptions would be provided in the Regulations: (a) to vehicles engaged in carrying out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency;

(b) to vehicles used for fire brigade, ambullance

or police purposes;
(c) to vehicles used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;
(d) to pedal bicycles with or without additional

means of propulsion;

(e) to vehicles prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or obliged to wait in order to avoid an accident;

(f) to vehicles waiting in lay-byes or off-street

standings; or

(g) to stage carriages or express carriages.

Waiting Restrictions

Urban District of Sunbury-on-Thames
