The London (Waiting and Loading) (Temporary Restriction) Regulations, 11960

(S.I. 1960/2109)

Under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, the Minister of Transport has made Regulations the effect of which is to:

(a) restrict the waiting of vehicles, including waiting for the purposes of loading and unloading, between 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and between 8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. on Saturdays, on prescribed lengths of road in the vicinity of selected junctions of the roads listed in

the Schedule hereto with other roads, and

(b) restrict the waiting of vehicles, for purposes
other than loading and unloading and those mentioned in paragraph 2 below, in prescribed lengths
of street adjoining the lengths mentioned in (a)

2. Exemptions would be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait on any of the lengths of road in order to pick up and set down passengers, to carry out essential services, or while in use by

bocal authorities in an emergency.

3. The lengths of street referred to in (a) above will be marked with a solid yellow line on the carriageway close to the kerb.
