Milford, Nov. 24.

Here are lately put in here by Contrary Winds the *Jeremy of Bristol* intended for *Bilboastre* *St. Ann of Burdeaux* bound for *Chester*, and the *Fricadship of London* from *Malaga* laden with Wines and Fruit homewards bound.

Yarmouth, Novemb. 29. On Saturday last sailed hence eight Marchant Ships bound for the *Streights*, ten or twelve more lie ready to follow, and may put out to Sea with the first fair Wind.

Madrid, Nov 11. The Queen is well recovered of her distemper, and the King confirmed in his health, giving daily proofs of his capacity and inclination to Martial affairs, and not long since an eminent proof of his good nature, when in his sports a quarrel happening with the young Marquis de *Morsara*, the King struck him, which the Marquis not bearing, returned, and a scuffle arose between them, but being parted, the young Marquis was taken out of his company; the next morning the King enquired after him, and being told, the Queen had forbidden him to come into his presence, the young King replied they did him wrong, and that he had been a coward if he had endured a box on the ear, and refused that day to dine till he was brought to him, who begging his pardon on his knees, the King told him he freely gave it him, and since he was now better acquainted with him then formerly, he should love him better then ever he did before.

The Marquis de *la Fuente* is upon recovery, and is believed may in few days be in readiness for his Ambassy to the Court of *France*.

The Duke de *Terra Nuova* having a quarrel with a Gentleman of *Piedmont*, caused his people to hamstring his Horses, which the Gentleman revenged upon the Dukes Mules, but being too weak to make good his party against the Duke, retired himself to the Count de *la Puerta's* house, whither the Duke pursued him, but the Queen being presently informed thereof, caused the Gentleman to be secured, and confined the Duke to one of his houses.

Cádiz, Nov. 13. Yesterday went hence the *Hambourgh* Convoy on their return homewards, consisting of about 26 Merchant ships, with some other vessels intending for *Amsterdam*.

Our Fleet is not yet arrived from the *Indies*, nor is it now expected before the end of *December*.

Letters of the 2d instant from *Tangier* informs us, that his Excellency the Lord *Howard* is yet there, expecting the return of the *Mary-Rose* with a *Siguro* or safe Conduct from *Muly Wshed*, otherwise called *Zaffares*, Emperour of *Morocco*, who has ordered Provisions to be made for the said Ambassadors entertainment at *Sally*; his daily allowance to be 50 Sheep, 4 Oxen, 100 Fowls, with a proportion of Flower, Oyl, Honey, and other conveniencies.

Letters of the 18th past from *Sally* tell us, that notwithstanding the promises of the Governour of that place, his men of war have continued to make their advantages at sea, and had brought in there 4 small *Newfoundland* vessels, 1. with Pilchards, and one small vessel of *pristols*; and from *Tyshan*, that the 4th instant, four Brigantines of *Argier* were in that Port, and that one of them had brought in with him a small ship from *Newfoundland* laden with Fish.

Rome, Nov. 16. The Pope is somewhat recovered from his great distemper, but still oppressed with Melancholly.

Inasmuch as his Relations still doubt that he will not long continue amongst them.

From *Spain* we are told that the Queen Regent still continues her inclination to favour her ancient consort *Father Nibhard*, and may in probability confer on him her Nomination for a vacant Cap.

'Tis believed His Holiness will speedily proceed to a promotion, in the which, *Monseignor Pallavicini*, and *Aquino* may have their shares, the former of which is Treated with extraordinary kindness by the Pope, in respect of the Marriage concluded on between his Nephew and the said *Pallavicini's* Niece, whose arrival is suddenly expected at *Castle Gondolfo*, where there is to be entertained till fitting preparations can be made for the solemnity of that marriage.

Balth Camillo Rospigliosi has some intentions of resigning the Charge of General for the Church, to his son upon this Marriage, to whom *Don Vincenzo* may upon his promotion to a vacant Cap, give up also his Command of General of the *Gillies*; both of these Charges being consiſtate, and to be held with his Government of the *Castle St Angelo* of which he is already possesſt.

Vienna, Novemb. 30. As yet the Necessity of Affairs has not obliged the Emperour to come to any Resolution either about the Retention of the Army, or the Change of the Great Officers and Commanders.

On Sunday last His Imperial Majesty received from *Poland* the News of the Conclusion of the Treaty of Marriage between the King and the Princess *Eleonor* his eldest Sister, to the great satisfaction of this Court. As soon as the Empress *Eleonor's* Birth-day is past, which is to be observed with extraordinary signes of Joy, the said Princess *Eleonor* is to be Treated as a Queen, and to have a Table allowed her accordingly.

The same Letters affirm, That either the Prince *Radzevil* or Prince *Ladomirski*, will be speedily dispatched hither with the Character of an Ambassador Extraordinary, upon the account of the said Marriage.

From *Hungary* we are advised, That the *Bassa* of *Newhausel* has with a Guard of about 500 Horse visited the Country round about thence, and taken a view also of *Leopoldstat*.

The *Vicer* of *Buda* has been lately in Conference with him for some days at *Newhausel*; 'tis more then suspected that they intend to form an Army, with a design to oblige the Country to give Obedience to the Grand Seignior. His apprehension has occasion'd the Assembly of the Estates of the Upper *Hungary* to put themselves into a posture of defence, and for their encouragement several Regiments are ordered to take up their Winter Quarters in the Lower *Assiria*, and other places bordering upon *Hungary*, to be in readiness to March upon the first orders.

Genoa, Nov. 20. Yesterday was conducted hither by one of our Gallies from *Arcyados* Town about 15 miles distant from this City, a large new ship, which is to carry 50 Guns, to be Commanded by *Seignior Vivand*.

This morning the Council is met to make choice of a General to Command six of the Gallies belonging to this Republick which are to be shipload for the transportation of *Segnora Donna Maria Camilla Pallavicina* to *Rome*, for the consummation of her Marriage with the Popes Nephew, the Senate having ordered a Gentleman to attend her and to Compliment her in her name upon the conclusion of that Treaty.
