### HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

*Borough of Christchurch (Fulmar Road to Mudeford)  
Public Path Creation Order, 1960*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 29 of the Highways Act, 1959, after consultation with the Christchurch Borough Council proposes to make an Order for the creation of a public footpath from Fulmar Road to Mudeford, Christchurch.

The draft Order relates to land situate in the Borough of Christchurch in the County of Hampshire.

Its effect will be to create a public footpath from a point in Mudeford approximately 137 feet east of Lawn Stables and proceeding in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 170 feet to Fulmar Road.

A copy of the draft Order and of the map contained therein has been deposited at the offices of the Christchurch Borough Council, Town Hall, Christchurch, and at the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, and will be open

for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

Any objection or representation concerning the draft Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 9th day of January 1961, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

*Highways at Wethersfield R.A.F. Station, Essex*

*Highway at Watnall R.A.F. Station, Notts.*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 49 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, as extended by section 8 of the Land Powers (Defence) Act, 1958, entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (County of Nottingham) (No. 8) Order, 1960" authorising the stopping up from the date when the Order comes into operation until 31st December 1963, of a footpath crossing Watnall R.A.F.
