Highways Act, 1959

Shilton Hill Diversion Improvements

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 9 of the above Act, providing—

- (a) For the realignment and regrading of a length of the road leading to Kirkby Mallory at Shilton Hill in the County of Leicestershire;
- (b) authority for (i) the stopping up of a length of the road to Kirkby Mallory, a part of the Birmingham—Great Yarmouth Trunk Road at its junction with the road to Kirkby Mallory, and lengths and parts of the footpaths that enter the said Trunk Road and the route of the Shilton Hill Diversion, and (ii) the construction by the Minister of a new road in substitution for the length to be stopped up and two new footpaths in substitution for the lengths and parts to be stopped up;
- (c) that the Leicestershire County Council shall become the highway authority for the new road on the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is open for through traffic;
- (d) that the Hinckley Urban District Council shall become the highway authority for the new footpaths on the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new footpaths are open for traffic.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Ministry of Transport, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1, and at the offices of the Leicestershire County Council, County Offices, Grey Friars, Leicester, and the Hinckley Urban District Council, 23 Station Road, Hinckley, and may be seen free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Copies of the Order, the title of which is "The Birmingham—Great Yarmouth Trunk Road (Shilton Hill Diversion Improvement) Order, 1960", can be obtained from the Ministry of Transport, Stationery Section, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of 12th January 1961, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Explanatory Note

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Classification) Regulations, 1948.

The Regulations provide that the National Dock Labour Board shall be treated for the purposes of the National Insurance Act, 1946, as the employer of persons employed as daily workers under the Dock Workers (Regulation of Employment) Scheme, 1947.
