PRESENT.

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the seventeenth day of January 1961, to delegate to the following Counsellors of State (subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned) or any two or more of them, that is to say, His Royal Highness Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent and Her Royal Highness The Princess Alexandra of Kent, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned) or any two behelf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas Her Majesty was further pleased to except from the number of the said Counsellors of State His Royal Highness Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, and His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent and Her Royal Highness The Princess Alexandra of Kent while absent from the United

And whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard of St. Laurence, Deacon and Martyr, in the Parish of Mickleton in the County of Gloucestershire, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 30th day of November 1960, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in exercise of the powers conferred on Her Majesty by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. '134), and of all other powers in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

I. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. Laurence, Deacon and Martyr, in the said Parish.

(a) In the Hamilton vault now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed at her decease of the body of Mary Graves Hamilton, subject

to the condition that the coffin be enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Frances Cowley, Ellen Buggins and Mary Ann Brain, subject to the condition that no part of the coffins containing the bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard of St. Laurence, Deacon and Martyr, Mickleton, Gloucestershire) Order, 1961.
