#### BOROUGH OF MIDDLETON.

*Walker Street, Chapel Street, Yates Street and  
Peter Street, Rhodes.*

Notice is hereby given that the Middleton Borough Council, as Highway Authority, intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Courthouse, Market Place, Middleton, at 10 a.m. on Monday, 10th April 1961, for an Order pursuant to section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising in respect of Walker Street, Chapel Street, Yates Street and Peter Street, Rhodes (which are connected with each other), the stopping up as unnecessary:

(1) for the purposes of all traffic:

(a) of such lengths of Walker Street (21 yards or thereabouts and 60 yards or thereabouts respectively) as lie firstly, between a point situate 56 yards or thereabouts in a westerly direction from its junction with Chapel Street and a point situate 35 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and secondly, between the said junction and a point situate 60 yards or thereabouts in an easterly direction from that junction and are shown coloured blue on the plan hereafter mentioned;

(b) of such length of Chapel Street (17 yards or thereabouts) (part width only) as lies between a point situate 18 yards or thereabouts in a southerly direction from its junction with Yates Street and a point situate 1 yard or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and is also shown coloured blue on the said plan;

(c) of such length of Yates Street (56 yards or thereabouts) as lies between a point situate 44 yards or thereabouts in an easterly direction from its junction with Chapel Street and a point situate 100 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and is also shown coloured blue on the said plan;

(d) of such lengths of Peter Street (8 yards or thereabouts and 65 yards or thereabouts (part width only) respectively) as lie firstly, between a point situate 12 yards or thereabouts in an easterly direction from its junction with Chapel Street and a point situate 20 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and secondly, between a point situate 28 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and a point situate 93 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from that junction and are also shown coloured blue on the said plan.

(2) Subject nevertheless to the reservation of a right of footpath over the whole width of each length of carriageway hereafter described:

(a) of such length of the carriageway of Walker Street (13 yards or thereabouts) as lies between a point situate 35 yards or thereabouts in a westerly direction from its junction with Chapel Street and a point situate 22 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and is shown coloured yellow on the said plan;

(b) of such lengths of the carriageway of Chapel Street (27 yards or thereabouts and 25 yards or thereabouts respectively) as lie firstly, between a point situate 27 yards or thereabouts in a southerly direction from its southerly junction with Yates Street and the said junction and

secondly, between its northerly junction with Yates Street and a point situate 25 yards or thereabouts in a northerly direction from that junction and are also shown coloured yellow on the said plan;

(c) of such length of the carriageway of Yates Street (2 yards or thereabouts) as lies between a point situate 42 yards or thereabouts in an easterly direction from its junction with Chapel Street and a point situate 44 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and is also shown coloured yellow on the said plan;

(d) of such length of the carriageway of Peter Street (8 yards or thereabouts) as lies between a point situate 4 yards or thereabouts in an easterly direction from its junction with Chapel Street and a point situate 12 yards or thereabouts in the like direction from the said junction and is also shown coloured yellow on the said plan.

A plan showing what will be the effect of the Order has been deposited at the Town Hall, Middleton, and may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours.

#### SALMON AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES ACT, 1923, AND THE RIVER BOARDS ACT, 1948

##### THE AVON AND DORSET RIVER BOARD

###### *Fishery Byelaws*

Notice is hereby given that the Avon and Dorset River Board intends to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice for the confirmation by the Minister of Agriculture Fisheries and Food of Byelaws made by the Board for securing the efficient discharge of its fishery functions.

The proposed byelaws relate to the taking of undersized trout and freshwater fish, the prohibition of night netting, the use of lures or baits with rod and line fishing for salmon and the use of a gaff in connection with rod and line fishing for salmon or migratory trout.

During a period of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice, a printed copy of the said byelaws will be deposited at the offices of the Board (as under) and will be open to public inspection, without charge, on any weekday during the
