Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard of St. Anne's Church, in the Parish of Baslow in the County of Derbyshire, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 14th day of April 1961, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council: Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. Anne's Church in the said Parish.

Provided that-

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave. adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard of St. Anne's Church, Baslow, Derbyshire) Order, 1961.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Church-wardens of the Parish of Stokenchurch in the County

wardens of the Parish of Stokenchurch in the County of Buckinghamshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in Stokenchurch Cemetery, Marlow Road, Stokenchurch, Bucks:

Provided that

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Cemetery, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three fact below the level of the graves of the ground feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 15th day of August next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 15th day of August.
