The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as herein-after directed in the old Churchyard of St. Constantine, in the Parish of Constantine in the County of Cornwall, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 26th day of May, 1961, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853, and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows: Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty

follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the old Churchyard of St. Constantine in the said Parish.

Provided that-

In earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial at their decease may be allowed of the bodies of Henry Beaufort Crowgey, Elizabeth Jane Crowgey and Blanche Annie Keys, subject to the conditions that no part of the coffins containing the bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the graves.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Old Churchyard of St. Constantine, Constantine, Cornwall) Order, 1961.
