The Trunk Road (London Road, Balderton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in that length of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A.1) in the Parish of Balderton, known as London Road,
