TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd September 1961, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th September 1961, to Saturday, the 30th September 1961, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m.

(Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

HOMICIDE ACT, 1957

An Inquisition indented, taken for our Sovereign Lady the Queen, at H.M. Prison, Wandsworth, pursuant to the directions of "The Capital Punishment Amendment Act, 1868," on the eighth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, before Gavin Leonard Bourdas Thurston, Coroner of our said Lady the Queen for the said county of London, on view of the body of Hendryk Niemasz now here lying dead at Her Majesty's Prison, Wandsworth, within the Jurisdiction of the said Coroner, upon the oaths of the undersigned Jurors, good and lawful men of the said county of London, who being now here duly chosen, sworn, and charged to enquire, for our said Lady the Queen, when, where, and in what manner, the said Hendryk Niemasz came to his death, say upon their oaths that the said Hendryk Niemasz was a Prisoner in the said Prison, indicted and convicted for the murder of Roderick Twells Buxton and sentenced to death for the said offence, after the passing of the said Statute. And that judgment of death was duly executed and carried into effect upon the said offender, for the said offence, on the day and year aforesaid, within the walls of the said Prison in which the said offender was confined at the time of execution. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further say that this Inquest is now here held, on view of the body of the said offender, by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said Prison belongs, within twenty-four hours after the execution; and that the body of the said Hendryk Niemasz now here lying dead, is the identical body of the said offender, who was so convicted and executed for the offence aforesaid. And that the said offender, at the time of his death was a male person of the age of forty-nine years and a Gardener.
