Under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, the Minister of Transport has made Amendment Regulations and Regulations coming into operation on 20th

September 1961, which together have the effect of prohibiting the driving of any mechanically propelled vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 m.p.h. on the length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

That part of road constituting the service road known as Parkside Terrace, Harington Terrace and Kipling Terrace, and being the western part of that length of road which extends from a point at the southern end of Parkside Terrace to a point at the northern end of Kipling Terrace, a distance of approximately 525 yards.
