THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868

THE GOVERNING BODY OF HARROW SCHOOL having, on the 27th day of September 1961, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Statute 4 of the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the *London Gazette* in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorised in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Harrow School on the 27th day of September 1961.

WHEREAS Statutes for the Government of Harrow School were made by the Governing Body of the said School under the Public Schools Act, 1868 and approved and sealed by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the said Act on the 24th day of February 1874.

And Whereas the said Governing Body in exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon them by section 11 of the said Act have resolved to alter Statute 4 of the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing.

Be it enacted as follows:

1. The fees payable by each boy at the Lower School of John Lyon may exceed £120 per annum but shall not exceed £156 per annum.

2. In all other respects Statute 4 of the above mentioned Statutes shall remain in force.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOCAL LOANS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Public Works Loans Act, 1897 (60 and 61 Vict. c. 51) as amended by the Public Works Loans Act, 1917 (7 and 8 Geo. 5 c. 32) and the Public Works Loans Act, 1918 (8 and 9 Geo. 5 c. 27) and the Housing (Financial Provisions) Act, 1958 (6 and 7 Eliz. 2 c. 42) they have directed by their Minute of 12th October 1961, that on loans advanced otherwise than on the security of local rates from the Local Loans Fund, on and after 14th October 1961, there shall be chargeable in lieu of the rates fixed by the Treasury Minute of 3rd August 1961, the following rates of interest:

Loans to housing associations as defined by the Housing Act, 1957, and the Housing (Scotland) Act, 1950:

For periods not exceeding 15 years ... 7½

For periods exceeding 15 years ... 7

II

Loans under the Housing Acts to companies and private persons, limiting their profits to the rate for the time being, prescribed:

For periods not exceeding 15 years ... 7½

For periods exceeding 15 years ... 7

III

Loans under the Housing Acts to companies and private persons, not limiting their profits as aforesaid:

For periods not exceeding 15 years ... 7½

For periods exceeding 15 years ... 7½

IV

Loans under the Harbours and Passing Tolls, etc., Act, 1861, with collateral security:

For periods not exceeding 15 years ... 7½

For periods exceeding 15 years ... 7

V

Loans under the Harbours and Passing Tolls, etc., Act, 1861, without collateral security:

For periods not exceeding 15 years ... 7½
