#### INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendments to the amended list published in the *London Gazette* of the 29th November 1957, as amended by notices published on the 17th January 1958, the 21st February 1958, the 29th April 1958, the 30th June 1958, the 31st October 1958, the 8th May 1959, the 29th May 1959, the 17th November 1959, the 30th April 1960, the 16th August 1960, the 27th September 1960, the 18th October 1960, the 11th November 1960, the 2nd December 1960, the 17th January 1961, the 3rd February 1961, the 23rd February 1961, the 21st March 1961, the 4th July 1961, the 22nd September 1961, the 20th October 1961 and of the 19th December 1961, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation) Order, 1954. These amendments shall take effect in relation to each person from the date specified after his name, being the date as from which, for the purposes of the said Order in Council, he first held or ceased to hold the office or employment in question.

#### DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1951

##### WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES

(Richard Frederick Whyte)

Whereas Richard Frederick Whyte, M.B., B.Ch., whose registered address is 17 Lansdowne Road, West Didsbury, Manchester 20, Lancashire, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1951:

And whereas the said Richard Frederick Whyte cannot in my opinion properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, apply:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 29 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, I hereby withdraw from the said Richard Frederick Whyte the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Richard Frederick Whyte to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953.
