RIVER BOARDS ACT, 1948

Somerset River Board Area

In pursuance of subsection (3) of section 6 of the River Boards Act, 1948, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, hereby gives notice that the Somerset River Board have made application under the said subsection that the map approved under subsection (2) of the said section showing the extent of the main river for the purposes of Part II of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, be varied by the addition to the said main river of:

1. Certain watercourses and parts of watercourses known as Old River Axe, Rhynemoor Supply (Rhyn and Rhynemoor (Rhyn, $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south east of Bleadon, Somerset.

2. Part of the lower River Axe together with certain connecting channels, at Wookey, Somerset.

And by the deletion from the said main river of:

3. A section of main river at Wookey, Somerset.

Plans bearing the reference S.O.1 on which the proposed additions and deletion are shown by lines in green colour and purple colour respectively, have been deposited at the Office of the Clerk to the Somerset River Board, 12 King Square, Bridgwater, Somerset, and at the Offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food (Room 410), Great Westminster House, Horseferry Road, London S.W.1, for public inspection for a period of thirty-five days from the date of this notice and may be inspected during normal office hours. A copy of the statutory map of the River Board Area on which is shown existing main river may also be inspected at the above addresses.

Any objection to the proposed variation of the statutory map should be made in writing and sent by post, addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food at the address mentioned above within thirty-five days from the date of this notice, quoting reference LDC.436A.

H.M. CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

16th February 1962.

To: THOMAS HENRY PUTTOCK, c/o British High Commissioner, Government Life Assurance Building, Custom House, Wellington, New Zealand.

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely a Bernadelli 6.35 mm. automatic pistol, No. 76718 and eight rounds of ammunition have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that—the said pistol and ammunition were imported into the United Kingdom contrary to the prohibition in force by virtue of the Import of Goods (Control) Order, 1954,

made under the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, whereby and by force of section 44 (b) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, and section 3 (1) of the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf, in default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
