Our Briftol thips bound for the streightrare lately put into this Ha bor by contrary winds, as also two French ships and one Londoner laden with Wines, with leveral Colliers bound &bout Land, oil waiting for a fair winds. - Valmouth, Dec. 8. Here lately arrived the Matty of Dartmouth from Malaga, and this day a Scorch skip from Retterdam intending for Nants, one great Londoner for Guiny with 4 or 5 other thips intending for France and about land.

Fenice, Nov. 30. General Barbaro has now received the Moneys deligned by the Senate to be carried with him into Palmatia, he is accordingly making preparations for his voyage, and may this next week put to fee upon the Gally Arbejana which arrived here yetterday, and is defigned

for his Transportation.

We have hitherto deferred the fending forwards to Suda the Presents intended for the Turkish Courts expecting first to have received Letters from the Captain General of our Armata with an atcount of all affairs relating to our late concluded peace 3 but we having in vain exp. cted shem these two months, they are ordered to be juimedimely fent away ; and the Segniors Labia and Moline to undertake their Convoy, and the rather, fince Letters arriving here from Genstantinepte by the way of Hungary Informs usy that the late peace concluded with this Republick has in all places throughout the Turkish Dominions. been received with great welcome and demonstrations of joy, not on y by the People but the Soldiery allo , and that the Grand Seguior has ratified and confirmed whatfoever has been agreed to by the Visier, and to take away all occasions of future differences about our bounds and limits in Dalmatia, has ordered several persons to be sent s es his Commissioners to meet with such as shall be sent s for that purpole by the Senste to examine all pretentions, and to fettle those parts in a perfect peace.

Bruffels, Dec. 17. Mague, Decemb. 17. The States are daily preparing for the security of the Frontiers, having particularly given Order for the Fortiscation of several Towns of Overysel, and upon the borders of Wesphalia. They intend also to fend several of their Forces to Beiledue, and Sas Van Gens, and to double the Garrisons upon the Frontiers; and have eauled Letters to be Written to the several Provinces, to invite them to come to such Resolution as may be of most advantage to the Publick Sasety, considering the present po-flure of Assairs.

This day the Officers taken into the Service of the States took their Oaths of Fidelity, and put in Socurity for performance of their Agreements, and particularly for the bringing their feveral Companies to a Rendezvous at the time appointed: The Principal Officers are as fol-

Edenbourgh , Decemb. &. This day was published here an Act for the Naturalization of strangers within the Kingdome of scotland, declaring. That all firangers of the Protestant Religion, that shall think fit to bring their Estates into the said Kingdome, or shall come to set up new Works and Manufocturies therein, Shall be Naturaliz'd, as Native-born Subjects of the faid Kingdom to all intents and purposes. His Majesty Declaring, That upon Application made unto His by such strangers , be wil grant unto them the Free and Publick Exercise of their Religion in their own Language, and the Liberty of having churches within the Isid Kingdome of Scote land; but no persons to have the benefit of the like Ad untill fish by Petition to the Lords of His Majestics Privy Council, Containing an exact Defignation of their Names, places of their Birth and former Refidence, and that they are of the protestant Religion, it be found by the Council that they are qualify'd according to the faid Act, and ought to have the benefit thereof. Farther Declaring, That the faid Ad, with an Exualt of the Act of Council in their Favour, shall be to them a sufficient Naturalization; Which Extract shell be given to them freely, without payment of any stoney or Compolition, lave onely the Fee of Nine pounds Stats Momey to the Clerks of the Counsel and their servants

Plymouth, Decemb. 10. On Wednesday last arrived here one Ship of this Town for Postugal, and 3 others from Malaga; here is also put in one Dutch Merchane ship, laden with Sugar and Tobacco, homewards

Lyme, Decemb. 11.
