We now begin to open a Trade again into the Le-, wante, one Ship rithly laden being already put to lea bound for Confiantizople, and two others lading for the fime place.

The Grand Signior is at prefent at Saloniche, expeding the arrival of the Visier with his Army from Candia, the intending to March with a confiderable firength into Conftantinople, being somewhat diffarissied at the inclinations shown by the People to his Brother's in the mean time has Ordered firong Guards to be kept about his Perfson

This week fome dorfliderable fums of Money were difributed amongst the dilmembred and dilabled foldiers returned from Candia. The Noble Grecians which have lost their Estates in the Island of *candia* have Lands affigned them in Istria, where they may plant then selves to their faits f ftion.
