

HAMPSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Hampshire (Petersfield Rural District No. 6)
(Parish of East Meon, Footpath No. 16)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1961*

On the 12th day of February 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert parts of the public right of way in the parish of East Meon shown in Column A of the Schedule hereto, to the routes shown opposite to such paths in Column B of the said Schedule.

The path referred to in the Order is Path No. 16 in the Parish of East Meon as shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under the provisions of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of G. H. Walker, Esq., Clerk of the Petersfield Rural District Council, The Old College, Petersfield in Hampshire, during the normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the day of publication of this notice, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of the notice, make application to the High Court.

A footpath commencing at point A on Road C.181 north of Park Farm and running south-westerly across pasture O.S. Parcel Nos. 317, 316A and 316 to point D on farm accommodation road, a distance of approximately 540 yards. Width 3 feet.

A footpath commencing at point E in the northern corner of pasture O.S. Parcel No. 291 and running south-westwards to point B in south-western corner, a distance of approximately 470 yards. Width 3 feet.

B

A footpath commencing at point C on Road C.181 south of Park Farm and running in a westerly direction along farm accommodation road to point D, a distance of approximately 240 yards. Width 3 feet.

A footpath commencing at point E in the northern corner of pasture O.S. Parcel No. 291 and running southwards and westwards along eastern and southern boundary to point B, a distance of approximately 613 yards. Width 3 feet.

The Gipping Rural District Council (Ringshall Hall Farm Footpaths) Diversion Order, 1961

On the 13th day of February 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to make diversions of certain lengths of footpaths Nos. 16, 17 and 26 all of which cross Ringshall Hall Farm in the parish of Ringshall. Footpath No. 16 is a right of way leading to Ringshall Church from the north and the length of path to be extinguished, situated in O.S. 133 is about 434 yards; the length of the new path will be about 460 yards. Footpath No. 17 is a right of way leading to Ringshall Church from the south-east and the length of path to be extinguished situated in O.S. 344, 343, 197, 196, 192 and 191, is about 693 yards; the length of the new path will be about 775 yards. Footpath No. 26 is a right of way leading to Ringshall Hall from the south and the length of footpath to be extinguished, situated in O.S. 206 and 204, is about 200 yards; the length of the new path will be about 420 yards. The old paths will be extinguished with effect from 13th March 1962.

GIPPING RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Gipping Rural District Council (Ringshall Footpaths) Extinguishment Order, 1961

On the 13th day of February 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish Footpaths Nos. 15 and 27 in the parish of Ringshall.

Footpath No. 15 commences at a point on the public highway leading from Ringshall to Battsford about 210 yards north of Ringshall Hall Farm and proceeds through O.S. 134 in a general easterly direction for a distance of 73 yards approximately and then in a general northerly direction through O.S. 134 and 129 for a distance of approximately 293 yards.

Footpath No. 27 runs from Ringshall Farm in a general southerly and south-easterly direction through O.S. 209, 208, 249, 248, 257 and 253 for a distance of 840 yards approximately to the before-mentioned public highway leading from Ringshall to Battsford.

The above footpaths will be closed with effect from 13th March 1962.

Rothwell Urban District Council (Mulberry Footpath) Public Footpath Diversion Order, 1962
