#### THORNBURY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Thornbury Rural District Council Henbury No. 1  
Extinguishment Order, 1962

The above Order made on the 12th day of February 1962, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to extinguish the following public rights of way:

- (a) The public right of way, approximately 140 feet in length over the footbridge and land of the British Transport Commission, in the Rural District of Thornbury between, on the north the enclosure numbered 2976 on the O.S. Gloucestershire Sheet 67 SE and, on the south, the boundary between the said Rural District and the County Borough of Bristol.
- (b) The public right of way approximately 1,400 feet in length between, on the north, the edge of the runway of Filton Airfield passing southwards through enclosures numbered 2594, 1187 and 2976 on the O.S. Gloucestershire Sheet 67 SE and connecting at the southward end with the northward end of path (a) above described.
- (c) The public right of way approximately 755 feet in length, between on the north-west Fishpool Hill passing in a south-easterly direction through enclosure numbered 1187 on the O.S. Gloucestershire Sheet 67 SE and connecting at the south-eastern end with the path (b) above described, where this path crosses the boundary between enclosures numbered 1187 and 2976.
- (d) The public right of way approximately 1,985 feet in length between on the east, Charlton

Common passing westward, thence south-westward through the enclosures numbered 5985 and 2976 on the O.S. Gloucestershire Sheet 67 SE and connecting at the south-western end with the junction between the paths (a) and (b) above described.

- (e) Part of the public right of way leading from Okebourne Road in the City and County of Bristol in an easterly and generally north-easterly direction, connecting at the eastern end of the boundary between the Rural District of Thornbury and the County Borough of Bristol, with the southward end of the footpath (a), above described. The part extinguished extends from a point 99 feet east of the junction with Okebourne Road, adjacent to the rear of the garden of No. 151 Okebourne Road, a total length of approximately 471 feet.
- (f) Part of that public right of way extending from Chakeshill Close, adjacent to No. 14 Chakeshill Close, in a north-westerly and generally northerly direction connecting at the northern end with the junction between the paths (a) and (e) above described. The part extinguished extends from a point 60 feet north-west of the junction with Chakeshill Close for a distance of approximately 810 feet.
