On the 12th April 1962, the Borough Council of Ellesmere Port made an Order under section & of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and subsection (2) of section 1:1 of, and subsection (1) of section 16 of, the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, the effect of which is (i) to prescribe, in relation to nine off-street parking places adjoining Marina Drive, Civic Way, Rivington Road and Snowdon Road at the Town Centre, Ellesmere Port, the classes of vehicles which may be left at those parking places and the conditions upon which vehicles may be so left and (ii) to empower the Council to remove from any of those parking places any vehicle left there in contravention of the Order, and to dispose of any such vehicle if it appears to the Council to have been such vehicle if it appears to the Council to have been abandoned.

CHRISTICHURCH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Christchurch (Various Streets) (One-way and Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1960, Amendment Order, 1962.

The Christchurch Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to:

(a) prohibit waiting on the south-east side of Wick Lane, Christchurch, from 27 yards south-west of the junction with Church Street to 60 yards south-west of that junction on all days between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (in addition to the existing prohibition of waiting on the northwest side);

(b) prohibit waiting in Church Street south-eastwards from Church Lane but excluding the length on the north-east side from the junction with Church Lane for a distance of 24 yards in a south-easterly direction on all days and at all

hours;
(c) prohibit waiting for a longer period than one hour between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on the north-east side of Church Street from the junction with Castle Street, to 24 yards south-east of the junction with Church Lane, but excluding the length from 20 yards south-east of the centre of the junction of Wick Lane to 29 yards south-east of that junction.

The Order will provide for the usual exemptions permitting vehicles to wait for the purposes of enabling persons to board or alight, goods to be loaded or unloaded, vehicles to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and enabling vehicles to be used in connection with funerals or building, etc., operations in the lengths of road.
