The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 5) Order, 1962.

This Order:

- (1) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on—
 - (a) imported cadmium metal used in the production of exported cadmium pigments;
 - (b) certain imported textile fibre waste used in the production of specified exported manufactures of man-made fibres or of man-made fibres and wool;
- (2) reduces the rate of drawback of import duty on imported soya beans used in the production of certain exported soya bean oil and of exported fish canned in soya bean oil;
- (3) varies the rates of drawback of import duty on certain imported square sawn wood and timber and wooden veneer sheets used in making exported sewing machine woodwork of specified types.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st May 1962 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1962, No. 848.

The Hydrocarbon Oil Duties (Drawback) (No. 3) Order, 1962.
