Highways Act, 1959

Wansford North By-Pass and Link Roads

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 and 44 of the above Act, the effect of which is:

- (a) that roads which he proposes to construct at Wansford in the County of the Soke of Peterborough shall become trunk roads on the date when the Order comes into operation;
- (b) that a length of the Old Great North Road (A.6118) shall become a trunk road on the date on which notice to that effect is given by the Minister to the County Council of the Soke of Peterborough;
- (c) that those lengths of the Birmingham—Great Yarmouth Trunk Road to be superseded shall

cease to be trunk roads on the 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the County Council of the Soke of Peterborough (who will become the highway authority responsible for those lengths) that the new roads are open for through traffic.
