

May 1962 (N.P. 4283/61) in the words following, viz:

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated 18th April 1962, rates of pay were laid down for Medical and Dental Officers of the Royal Navy to have effect from 1st April 1962 and 1st April 1963:

"And whereas we consider that these rates require revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the rates of pay set out in the accompanying Schedule to have effect from 1st April 1962:

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. John's, Haverton Hill, Billingham, in the County of Durham, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. John's Churchyard in the said Parish, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body

of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 10th day of August next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 10th day of August.
