Notice is hereby given that the Battersea Metropolitan Borough Council in exercise of the powers contan Borough Council in exercise of the powers con-flerred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 20th day of June 1962, made an Order entitled the Metropolitan Borough of Battersea (No. -3) Smoke Control Order, 1962, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Clean Air Act, 1956, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that fine not exceeding £10 unless the proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised

fuels, gas and electricity.

Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Lavender Hill, Battersea, London, S.W.11, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 20th day of July 1962.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area is approximately 291 acres and is bounded by Broomwood Road (even numbers) on the south, Battersea Rise (odd numbers) and Clapham Common North Side on the north and the borough boundaries on Wandsworth Common on the west and Clapham Common on the east.

The boundary of the area is defined and is shown more particularly by the map referred to in the Order. The area includes the following roads or parts of
