Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain)

(36)) as amended by the Wages Regulation (Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear) (Amendment) Order 1961 (Order R.D.O. (38)) and (2) the revocation of Order R.D.O. (36) and Order R.D.O. (38).

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS,
1944 AND 1947*Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way
County Borough of Bristol*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in exercise of powers conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public right of way over part of a footpath across Brislington Trading Estate.

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

Aylesbury Rural District (Footpaths at Moat Farm, Buckland) Diversion Order, 1962, and Extinguishment Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that C. Johnson, Esq., F.R.I.C.S., will attend at the Church Schoolroom, Buckland, on Wednesday, 22nd August, 1962, at 10.45 a.m., for the purpose of hearing objections which have been made to the above-named Orders.

The effect of the Orders if confirmed by the Minister, would be

(1) To divert the public rights of way commencing at

(a) a point on the western boundary of O.S. No. 232 south of Model Row and leading in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 835 feet to the north-western corner of O.S. No. 220, south of Church Farm, and

(b) a point to the north of the Methodist Chapel and leading in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 515 feet to a point on the southern boundary of O.S. No. 232,

and to substitute for these footpaths commencing at

(a) the said point on the western boundary of O.S. No. 232 and leading in a southerly direction along the western boundary of O.S. No. 232 to a point approximately 420 feet north-west of the Methodist Chapel, then in a south-easterly direction to a point approximately 210 feet east of the Methodist Chapel then in a generally south-easterly direction along the western boundary of O.S. No. 232 to a point at the north-western corner of O.S. No. 220 south of Church Farm, a distance of approximately 917 feet, and

(b) a point on the western boundary of the said O.S. No. 232 to the north of the Methodist Chapel and leading in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 514 feet to a point on the northern boundary of O.S. No. 231; and

(2) to extinguish the public rights of way leading from

(a) a point on the western boundary of O.S. No. 232 approximately 420 feet north-west of the Methodist Chapel and running in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 619 feet to a point on the northern boundary of O.S. No. 231 approximately 250 feet north-east of Church Farm, and

(b) the said point approximately 420 feet north-west of the Methodist Chapel on the western boundary of O.S. No. 232 and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 567 feet to a point north of the said Church Farm.
