## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

### KINGSTON-UPON-THAMES BOROUGH COUNCIL

#### *The Kingston-upon-Thames (No. 3) Smoke Control Order, 1962*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 2nd day of August 1962, made an Order entitled the Kingston-upon-Thames (No. 3) Smoke Control Order, 1962, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of October 1963, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Guildhall, Kingston-upon-Thames, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 11th day of August 1962.

The Order also amends the Kingston-upon-Thames (No. 1) Smoke Control Order, 1961, which comes into operation on the 1st October 1962. The amendment provides for a further exemption from the operation of the Order, and relates to fireplaces equipped with mechanical stokers.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

#### SCHEDULE

That part of the Royal Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames bounded by a line commencing at the point where the municipal boundary crosses Cambridge Road, proceeding north-westward along

the centre of Cambridge Road to its junction with London Road and continuing north-eastward along the centres of London Road and Kingston Hill to the municipal boundary, thence southward along the boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid
