The Bootle (Street Parking Places No. 2) Order, 1962

The Council of the County Borough of Bootle propose to make an Order under Section 81 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and Sub-Section (2) of Section 11 of, and Sub-Section (1) of Section 16 of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960 the effect of which will be to authorise the use of the under-mentioned lengths of road as parking places by such classes of vehicles in such positions and during such hours as are specified in relation to such lengths in the Schedule set out below.

The Order will be in the form of a variation Order amending the Schedule to the Bootle (Street Parking Places No. 1) Order, 1962, by the addition thereto of the under-mentioned lengths of road.
