# PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934

In pursuance off section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Pro-duction) Act, 1934, the Minister of Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1905, as amended, he has granted to BP Exploration Company Limited, Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London E.C.2, nine prospecting licences, details of which are given in the Schedule below. The boundaries are described from the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "

# SCHEDULE

An area of approximately 186 square miles in the Counties of Bedford, Huntingdon and Northampton.

#### Northern Boundary

Commencing at Oundle the boundary follows the road eastwards through Ashton and Lutton to Stilton.

#### Eastern Boundary

Eastern Boundary Commencing at Stilton the boundary follows the A.I. southwards through Sawtry to Alconbury Hill and the A.14 through The Stukeleys and Hunting-don to Godimanchester. Thence it follows the road through Offord Cluny, Great Paxton, St. Neots and Eaton Socon to the road junction on the A.1 between Wyboston and Brookhouse Bridge.

#### Southern Boundary

Commencing on the A.I near Brookhouse Bridge the boundary follows the road generally westward through Chawston, Colesden, Channel's End, Root-ham's Green and Chapel End to Colmworth.

# Western Boundary

Commencing at Columworth the boundary follows Commencing at Colimworth the boundary follows the road northwards through Little Staughton, Great Staughton, Stonely, Kümbolton and Tilbrook to Covington. It then proceeds westwards through Har-grave and Chelveston to Higham Ferrers and north-wards to the railway line at Irthlingborough Station It then follows the railway line northwards to Thraps-ton whence it follows the road through Thorpe Waterville and past Barnwell Station to Oundle. IAn area of approximately 193 square miles in the Counties of Cambridge and Huntingdon.

# Northern Boundary

Commencing at Stilton, the boundary follows Stil-ton Dyke eastwards into Coldcote Dyke, Black Ham Drove, New 60R North Western Cut, Devill's Leam and Twenty Foot River as far as Hobb's Lot Farms whence it follows the road to the railway line at Ring's End.

## Eastern Boundary

Eastern Boundary From Ring's End the boundary follows the railway line southwards through March Station to Stonea Station. It then follows the road alongside Sixteen Foot Drain past Poole's Bridge, Boot's Bridge and Mount Pleasant Bridge to Sixteen Foot Bridge at Horseway, whence it follows Forty Foot Drain west-wards to the railway line at Dock Bridge near Chat-teris. From Dock Bridge it again follows the rail-way line southwards through Chatterie and Somers-ham to Needingworth Crossing and along the road through St. Ives to Galley Hall, near Fenstanton.

#### Southern Boundary

From Galley Hill the boundary follows the A.604 westwards to Godmanchester.

# Western Boundary

From Godmanchester the boundary follows the A.14 northwards through Huntingdon and The Stukeleys to Alconbury Hill and along the A.1 through Sawtry to Stilton.

An area of approximately 187 square miles in the Countries of Bedford, Cambridge and Huntingdon.

#### Northern Boundary

Commencing at Godmanchester the boundary follows the A.604 eastwards through Fenstanton to the crossroads by Bell Farm near Dry Drayton.

#### Eastern Boundary

Commencing at Bell Farm the boundary follows the road southwards through Dry Drayton to the junction with the A.45 near Hardwick Hall. It then follows the A.45 westwards to Eltisley and thence continues southwards through Waresley, Gamlingay, Potton and Displayments in Surface Biggleswade to Shefford.

# Southern Boundary

From Shefford the boundary follows the A.507 westwards through Clophill to Ampthill, thence on to the crossroads beyond Ampthill Railway Tunnet at Millbrook.

#### Western Boundary

From Millbrook the boundary follows the road northwards to the railway line at Millbrook Station, then contlinues along the railway line to Bedford. From Bedford it follows the road past Bedford General Hospital to Cleat Hill, past Lower Grange, General Hospital to Cleat thill, past Lower Grange, Ravensden, to the road junction near Southfields, and eastwards to Rootham's Green, Channel's End, Duck's Cross and Chawston, whence at follows the A.I nonth-wards through Wyboston to Eaton Socon. It then ifollows the road through St. Neots, Great Paxton and Offord Cluny to Godmanchester. An area of approximately 193 square miles in the Counties of Cambridge, Huntingdon and Norfolk.

#### Northern Boundary

Commencing at Stonea Station the boundary follows the railway line in a south-easterly direction for about a mile and Darcey Lode in a north-easterly direction to the road at Hole in the Wall Farm. It then follows the road through Welney across Old Bedford Bridge and Delph Bridge to the Suspension Bridge across the New Bedford River or Hundred Foot Drain. Thence it follows Old Croft River to the county boundary and proceeds along the county county boundary and proceeds along the county boundary as far as Brandon Creek on the River Ouse.

#### Eastern Boundarv

Eastern Boundary From Brandon Creek the boundary follows the Little Ouse River southwards to Fellowelt Anchor, thence along White House Drove to White House Bridge, along Mädenhaft Road and Mäle End Road to the railway line at Mäle End. It then follows the railway line in a south-westerly direction through Ely and Little Thetford to West River Bridge near Stretham and the Ouse or Old West River to the Bridge Inn on the B.1049.

# Southern Boundary

From the Bridge Inn the boundary follows the B.1049 in a south-westerly direction to Cottenham and the road through Westwick and Oakington to the A.604 at Bell Farm. It then follows the A.604 west-wards through Fenstanton to Galley Hill.

#### Western Boundary

From Galley Hill the boundary follows the road northwards through St. Ives to the ratilway line at Needingworth Crossing and the ratilway line through Somersham and Chatteris to Dock Bridge. It then
