From the Duke of Savoy's Camp at Picighittone, Octo-ber 28. N. S.

His Town furrendred yesterday upon Articles, the Garison being allowed to march out with the usual Marks of Honour, and to be conducted to Cremona; and accordingly all the French Troops in the Place are to march out this day; but Troops in the Place are to march out this day; but the Germans, Swifs, Italians and Spaniards, have either englints the Service of the Allies, or defired Paffes to return home, few or none of them continuing in French Pay. The Dake of Savoy intends to march from hence to morrow in order to join Prince Eugene, and will leave the Prince of Heffe with a Body of about 7000 Men, which will be fufficient to fearthe Adda; to observe the French Troops under General Medavi, and pievent his making any Attempt, while the rest of our Forces are employed in reducing the Castle of Tortona, Gazal and Valenza; in the doing of which we expect no Opposition, the Reduction of Alexandria and the Town of Tortona having entirely deprived the Enemy of any Communication with this Country by the way of Genda, without which it will be very difficult for their Troops to substit in these Parts: And this Consideration, with that of the ill State of their Troops, which are now in Dauphine; and the Sesson's being far advanced, will in all probability prevent their attempting to return into Piedmont.

Gensa, Ottober 31. W. S. The Pope's Gallies shat were in this Port set Sail this Morning with a fair Wind for Civita-Vecchia. We have an Account from Spain, That the Forces on both sides are gone into Winter Quarters; and that his Catholick Majesty intended to call an Assembly of the States of Valentia, to meet in the Capital of that Kingdom.

The Duke of Savoy is now at Grospello, between Pavia and Casal, with the Body of Troops which was employed in the Siege of Picighittone: Since the Surrender of which Place his Royal Highness has retaken Asti: The Garison consisted of 40 Officers, and 320 private Men, who all surrendred themselves Prisoners of War. Prince Eugene, with the Troops under his Command, continues at Alexandria. Mortara and Valenza are both blocked up by Detachments of the Confederate blocked up by Detachments of the Confederate Troops; but the Weather being very rainy, de-lays the Execution of his Royal Highness's further Deligns.

Vienze, Nev. 6. The Imperial Forces in Hungary, under the Command of General Statemberg, marched the 2d Inftant to Little Schizen, where they were joined by General Palfi with the Troops under his Command and the name Day they advanged to Pier Command; and the next Day they advanced to Biesbeck, where they are making a Bridge over the Da-Bube.

Fraucfort, Nov. 14. Orders are given for supplying the Magazines at Landau with considerable Quarties of Provisions and Ammunicion; and after that is done, our Troops on the other fide of the Rhine will repass that River, and march into Winter Quarters. The Enemy's Forces are preparing to do the like. Letters from Italy say, they have had excellive Rains there, which have caused the Po and the Seechie of Other Parkers and have done the Secchia to overflow their Banks; and have done a great deal of Damage to the Countries lying near those Rivers.

Hanover, Nov 16. On Sunday the 14th Instant, at 7 in the Evening, the Ceremony of the Marriage between the Prince Royal of Prussia and the Princess of Hanover was performed with great Solemnity, the Electoral Prince being his Royal Highness's Proxy.
