**Road Traffic Act, 1962—Section 37**

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has made "The Control of Dogs on Roads Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations, 1962," (S.I. 1962/2340).

These Regulations, which come into operation on the 1st November 1962, prescribe the procedure to be followed in connection with the making by Local authorities of orders under section 220 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, being orders which specify roads on which dogs must be held on a lead.

**The London Traffic (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1962 (S.I. 1962/2341)**

Under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, the Minister of Transport has made Regulations, coming into operation on 31st October 1962, which, in conjunction with "The London Traffic (Restricted Roads) (No. 13) Order, 1962," (S.I. 1962/2342), will have the effect of removing the 40 m.p.h. speed limit from the length of road specified in the Schedule hereto and replacing it with a 30 m.p.h. speed limit on a shorter length of road.

That length of the Sevenoaks—Redhill—Guildford Road (A.25), at Sundridge, which extends from 160 yards east of Dryhill Lane westwards to 25 yards west of the centre-line of the "Lamb" public-house, a distance of approximately 1200 yards.

**RIVER BOARDS ACT, 1948**

**Essex River Board Area**

In pursuance of subsection (3) of section 6 of the River Boards Act, 1948, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby gives notice that the Essex River Board have made application under the said subsection that the map approved under subsection (2) of the said section showing the extent of the main river for the purposes of Part II of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, be varied by the addition to the said main river of:

Part of the River Ter from the ford near Lower Ray's Farm, Willows Green, to its junction with the existing head of main river at Hatfield Peveril, together with an un-named watercourse, flowing into the River Ter near Priory Farm, and the mill race at Hatfield Place, Hatfield Peveril.

A plan on which the proposed addition is shown by lines in red colour has been deposited at the Offices of the Clerk of the Braintree Rural District Council, St. Peter's Close, Bocking, Braintree, Essex, and at the Offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food (Room 410), Great Westminster House, Horseferry Road, London S.W.1, for public inspection for a period of twenty-eight days from the date of the publication of this notice and may be inspected during normal office hours. A copy of the statutory map of the River Board Area on which is shown existing main river may also be inspected at the above addresses.

Any objection to the proposed variation of the statutory map should be made in writing and sent by post, addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, at the address mentioned above, within twenty-eight days from the date of the publication of this notice, quoting reference LDC 628.
