The Hampshire (Romsey and Stockbridge Rural District No. 6) (Parish of Lockerley, Footpath No. 21) Public Path Diversion Order 1962

The Hampshire (Kingsclere and Whitchurch Rural District No. 13) (Parish of Overton, Footpath No. 5) Public Path Diversion Order 1962

On the 11th day of October 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Orders.

The effect of the Orders will be to divert the public rights of way described in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, to the routes described in Column 2 thereof.

The footpaths referred to in the Orders are Paths Nos. 5 and 21 in the Parishes of Overton and Lockerley, respectively, as shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under the provisions of Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

Copies of the Orders and the maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge during the office hours, at the offices indicated in Column 3 of the Schedule.

The Orders become operative as from the day of publication of this notice, but if any person aggrieved by the Orders, or either of them, desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that they, or either of them, are not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Orders, or either of them, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

Commencing opposite Butlers Wood on the Newtown-Carters Clay Road U.86, at a point 900 yards south of its junction at Carters Clay with Road C.186 leading to Sherfield English, running in a north-westerly direction across the field forming the northern part of O.S. Parcel No. 266, to the south-eastern corner of field O.S. Parcel No. 265, a distance of 250 yards.	Commencing at its junction with the existing path at a point on Road U.86, running in a south-westerly direction along the southern boundary of the field forming the northern part of O.S. Parcel No. 266, to its western edge of the Parish boundary, thence in a north-north-westerly direction along the western edge of the field to rejoin the existing path at the south-eastern corner of field O.S. EAST KESTEVEN RURAL DISTRICT

East Kesteven Rural District Council, Osbournby No. 7 and Aunsby No. 16 Public Path Diversion Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that on the 22nd day of October 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the footpath commencing at the end of North Street, and crossing fields OS Nos. 3, 5 and 11 in the parish of Osbournby, and the footpath crossing field O.S. No. 56 in the parish of Aunsby, and thence to a point 34 yards South of its junction with the Sleaford-Bourne Road, being approximately 1,190 yards in length, to a line running from the end of North Street, Osbournby, Westerly to the South West corner of field OS No. 11, and thence in a Northerly direction along the Western boundaries of fields O.S. Nos. 11, 5 and 3 in the parish of Osbournby, and in the parish of Aunsby from the end of the aforesaid footpath No. 7 in a North Westerly direction for approximately 163 yards to the North East corner of the wood known as Middle Plantation, from thence in a Westerly direction for a distance of 200 yards to the edge of the plantation and thence Northwards for a distance of approximately 44 yards, and thence along the Eastern boundary of the wood known as Tally Hol Plantation for a length of approximately 524 yards, and thence in an easterly direction along the Northern boundary of field O.S. No. 56 for a distance of approximately 168 yards to the existing footpath No. 16, 34 yards South of its junction with the Sleaford-Bourne Road, the whole being approximately 1,539 yards in length.

The existing path will be closed as from the 23rd November 1962.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, 18

Northgate, Sleaford, Lincs, during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 2nd day of November 1962, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

NIDDERDALE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Nidderdale Rural District Council (Lund House Green) Public Path Diversion Order, 1962

The above Order made on the 24th day of October 1962, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert a length of approximately 65 yards of a public right of way running from Hill Top Lane, Lund House Green, through the yard of premises occupied by John Hayton & Son, Agricultural and Horticultural Merchants and Engineers, in a south westerly direction, to a line running from a point in Hill Top Lane approximately 27 yards to the south-east of the present starting point of the public right of way and thence in a west-south-westerly direction over land belonging to J. C. Ingle for a distance of 57 yards or thereabouts to join up with the existing public right of way.
