The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels cas and anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into opera-tion before the 1st October 1963, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.
