

CHESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Chester (Minshull Street and Tatton Street, Knutsford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1963.

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th December 1962, the Cheshire County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to impose prohibition of waiting daily between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the following lengths of road in Knutsford:

Minshull Street—From its junction with King Street, A.537, to its junction with Tatton Street.

Tatton Street—From a point 25 yards south of its junction with Minshull Street to a point 30 yards north of its junction with Minshull Street.

The Order will come into operation on the 7th January 1963, and contains the usual exemptions to permit vehicles to wait for the purposes of loading or unloading goods, allowing persons to board or alight or to enable works to be carried out in the length of road.

STAMFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Stamford (Parking Places) (No. 2) Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that on the 31st December 1962, the Stamford Borough Council made an Order under section 81 (1) and (19) of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and section 11 (2) and section 16 (1) of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, the effect of which is to:—

(a) revoke all the Council's existing Orders and Byelaws in operation within the Borough regulating the use of parking places;

(b) authorise the parking of vehicles on defined parts of the following streets:

All Saints' Place, Bath Row, Broad Street (three sections), High Street, St. George's Square, St. Mary's Place, Station Road, Belton Street (two sections), Recreation Ground Road and Red Lion Square.

(c) authorise the parking of vehicles on the following off-street car parks:

St. Leonard's Street Car Park and Bath Row Car Parks.

(d) (i) define the days and hours of the operation of each parking place;

(ii) describe the position in which vehicles may be left on the parking places;

(iii) specify the classes of vehicles which may wait on each parking place.

(e) empower the Council to tow away any vehicle left in a parking place in contravention of the Order. If it appears that such a vehicle has been abandoned, then in certain circumstances, the Council may dispose of the vehicle.

The Order will come into operation on 1st February 1963.

LEAMINGTON SPA BOROUGH COUNCIL

Borough of Royal Leamington Spa (Prohibition or Restriction of Waiting) Order No. 1, 1963

Notice is hereby given that on 1st January 1963 the Leamington Spa Borough Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule hereto.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for persons to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from a vehicle, or to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, removal of any obstruction to traffic, or the maintenance of the

road and the services therein. This Order comes into operation on Monday, 14th January 1963.

THE SCHEDULE referred to

Avenue Road—from the Public Library eastwards to its junction with Lower Avenue. No waiting on North side.

High Street—from its junction with Wise Street westwards to Tachbrook Road. No waiting, North and South sides.

Packington Place—whole length. No waiting on West side, Monday to Saturday only.

Regent Street—from its junction with the Parade eastwards to Regent Grove. No waiting, and waiting to be restricted to 30 minutes in any one hour on each side on alternate days.

Tachbrook Road—from its junction with High Street, southwards to the Grand Union Canal bridge. No waiting on East side.

SOUTHEND-ON-SEA COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

County Borough of Southend-on-Sea (Marine Parade, Leigh) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1963

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Southend-on-Sea propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle on the following lengths of road for the periods stated:

Lengths of Road

The south side of Marine Parade, Leigh, from Belton Way (East) to Belton Way (West).

Hours of Prohibition

24 hours daily.

Lengths of Road

The north side of Marine Parade, Leigh from the junction with Hadleigh Road westwards to a point 10 yards west of the west kerb line of Harley Street.

Hours of Prohibition

8 a.m. to 11.30 p.m.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of furniture or of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.
