*Daventry R.D.C. (Hellidon) Public Path
Extinguishment Order, 1962*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 18th day of December 1962, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to extinguish the public right of way running from the south-east corner of that part of O.S. 143 abutting on the village street in Hellidon leading in a north-easterly direction for approximately 70 yards, thence in an easterly direction for approximately 230 yards to Leam House and thence to its junction with the bridleway from the Red Lion Inn to Leam Pool.

The Rural District Council of Bridge-Blean (Unscheduled Footpath, Ship Meadow, Upstreet, Chislet) Extinguishment Order, 1962.

GLOUCESTER COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Gloucester County Borough Council (Grange Road Estate) Public Path Diversion Order, 1963

Notice is hereby given that the above Order, made on the 2nd day of January 1963, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation. Its effect will be to divert a section of public right of way running from a point in Grange Road to the north of 80 Grange Road to land at the rear of 15 Sandringham Avenue. The new route will be by Grange Road, Windsor Drive and Sandringham Avenue, and by a new footpath to be provided on the east side of 17 Sandringham Avenue and at the rear of Numbers 17 and 15 Sandringham Avenue. The new route will be more commodious than the path which is to be diverted.
