This day the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that The Lords authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, to desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read, and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th March 1963, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £210,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 11th March 1963, to Saturday, the 16th March 1963, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose

Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under sections 3 (6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 1) Order 1963.

This Order provides that certain goods listed in the Order shall be temporarily exempted from import duty and certain others shall continue to be exempted from import duty until 1st January 1964 unless a shorter period is indicated against any item in the Order.

The Order also corrects a spelling error in Schedule 2 to the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 6) Order 1962.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th March 1963, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1963, No. 355.

The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 1) Order 1963.

This Order revokes the existing provision for the allowance of drawback of import duty on imported linseed oil used in the manufacture of fishing nets, and provides for the alteration of the rates of drawback of import duty on imported linseed and linseed oil used in the manufacture of specified exported goods including printers' inks.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th March 1963, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1963, No. 354.

### INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950

In pursuance of subsection (1) (a) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendment to the list, published in the *London Gazette* of the 31st March 1959, as amended by a notice published on the 13th April 1962, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the Inter-governmental Maritime Consultative Organisation (Immunities and Privileges) Order, 1959. This amendment shall take effect in relation to the person named from the 1st March 1963, being the date as from which, for the purposes of the said Order in Council, he first held the office or employment in question.
