WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959

FUR WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

The Fur Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the First Schedule to the Wages Regulation (Fur) Order 1961 (Order Z. (79)); (2) the same amendment to the Fur Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order 1953 (Order Z. (61)) as that now contained in the Second Schedule to Order Z. (79); and (3) the revocation of Order Z. (79).

THE ELECTRICITY (ESSEX UNDERTAKINGS) (VARIATION OF AREAS AND TRANSFER) ORDER 1963.

Electricity Act 1947

The Minister of Power gives notice that he has made The Electricity (Essex Undertakings) (Variation of Areas and Transfer) Order 1963 (S.I. 1963 No. 555) which varies the boundaries between the areas of the London Electricity Board and the Eastern Electricity Board by (i) including the former area and excluding from the latter, part of the Urban District of Chigwell which was made part of the area of the Eastern Electricity Board on its establishment under the Electricity Act 1947, and (ii) including in the latter area, and excluding from the former, part of the Borough of Dagenham which was made part of the area of the London Electricity Board on its establishment under the Electricity Act 1947.

The Order also transfers from the London Electricity Board to the Eastern Electricity Board

certain electricity undertakings in the County of Essex which are in the area of the Eastern Electricity Board, but which vested in the London Electricity Board under the Electricity Act 1947.
