Warfaw, Jan. 1. Francfort, Jan. 12. The Landgrave of Hesse-Darm-stad passed thro' this Place yesterday, in his Return from Hanau to Darmstad. The Body of the late Prince Lewis, Margrave of Baden, was carried from Rastad the 9th Instant, to be interred at Baden, with his Ancestors, without any Solemnity, as his Highness had directed by his Will.
