- 2. On the western side of King George's Avenue from the junction with Millbrook Road for a distance northwards of 50 feet.
- 3. On the northern side of Millbrook Road from the junction with King George's Avenue eastwards to a point 120 feet east of the junction with Regent's Park Road.
- 4. On the western side of Regent's Park Road from the junction with Millbrook Road for a distance northwards of 50 feet.
- 5. On the eastern side of Regent's Park Road from the junction with Millbrook Road for a distance northwards of 50 feet.
- 6. On the southern side of Millbrook Road from a point opposite the western kerb line of King George's Avenue for a distance westwards of 150 feet and eastwards of 150 feet.
- 7. On the southern side of Millbrook Road from a point opposite the western kerb line of Regent's Park Road for a distance westwards of 190 feet and eastwards of 160 feet.
