(Willingale) Public Path Diversion Order, 1963*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on 23rd April 1963 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert public rights of way in the Parish of Willingale as follows:

1. The public footpath in the Parish of Willingale commencing on the south side of Shellow Road on the northern boundary of enclosure 42 opposite the entrance to Totrells Hall and approximately 270 feet west of Pound House, running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,690 feet across enclosure 42 entering enclosure 44 at the north western corner thereof continuing inside the western boundary of enclosure 44 to the south western corner of that enclosure, continuing into and across enclosure 39, entering enclosure 183 and continuing to the south western corner thereof, east of Willingale Rectory—to be diverted so as to commence on the south side of Shellow Road in the north eastern corner of enclosure 42 immediately west of Pound House and running in a southerly direction alongside the western boundary of Pound House, then continuing across enclosure 42 for a distance of approximately 270 feet into enclosure 44, continuing in a southerly direction inside the eastern boundary of enclosure 44 for a distance of approximately 690 feet to the south eastern corner thereof, entering enclosure 39, turning east and running inside the northern boundary of that enclosure for a distance of approximately 80 feet to the north eastern corner thereof, turning south and continuing inside the eastern boundary of enclosure 39 for a distance of approximately 430 feet to the south eastern corner thereof, there turning west towards Willingale Rectory and continuing inside the southern boundary of enclosure

39, for a distance of approximately 440 feet, then entering the north western corner of enclosure 183 and continuing in a southerly direction inside the western boundary of enclosure 183 for a distance of approximately 240 feet to the south western corner of that enclosure, terminating at the same point as at present.

2. The public footpath in the Parish of Willingale commencing at the north eastern corner of enclosure 185 to the east of Willingale Rectory, running in a south westerly direction across enclosure 185 for a distance of approximately 820 feet to the north western corner of enclosure 187 where it connects with a footpath running from the Bell Inn to Wood Lane—to be diverted so as to commence in the north eastern corner of enclosure 185 to the east of Willingale Rectory and running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 740 feet inside the eastern boundary of enclosure 185 to the south eastern corner thereof where it enters enclosure 187a and joins the existing footpath running from the Bell Inn to Wood Lane.

(All references to enclosure numbers are those as shown on Ordnance Survey Essex (New Series) Sheet L.111.10 (Edition of 1920).)
