ROYAL WARRANT OF PRECEDENCE

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Robin Michael Parker, Esquire, Major the King's Royal Rifle Corps and Nigel Geoffrey Parker, Gentleman, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the sons of an Earl which would have been due to them respectively had their father John Holford Parker, Esquire (commonly called The Honourable John Holford Parker) survived his brother Montagu Brownlow, Earl of Morley and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Morley.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendments to the amended list published in the *London Gazette* of the 22nd January 1963, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by The Diplomatic Privileges (International Civil Aviation Organisation) Order in Council, 1949, as amended by The Diplomatic Privileges (World Health Organisation and International Civil Aviation Organisation) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1949, and The International Organisations (Immunities

and Privileges of the International Civil Aviation Organisation) (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1954 (hereinafter together referred to as the Order in Council). These amendments shall take effect in relation to each person from the date specified after his or her name, being the date as from which, for the purposes of the said Order in Council, such person first held or ceased to hold the office or employment in question:

MARKING OF ELECTRIC INCANDESCENT LAMPS

The Board of Trade announce that in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 3 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, they have given a Direction, namely, the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order, 1928 (Provisional Exemption) Direction 1963 in regard to the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order 1929, as amended.

The Direction exempts imported incandescent lamps of the following descriptions from having to bear an indication of origin as prescribed by the Order and permits the indication to be indelibly
