HE Preparations are continued on this side for the ensuing Campaign; and the Marquis de Frontero is sent for from Valentia to serve under the Duke de Cadaval, whom the King has given the chief Command of his Forces. Cologne, Feb. 8. The Count de Rechteren, Go-vernor of Traerbach, is lately gone from thence to the Hague, to receive his Powers and Instructions from the States General, who have appointed him to Negociate some Matters at the Court of Vienna; and with several Princes of the Empire, which relate to a vigorous carrying on of the War the next Campaign. They write from Traerbach, That a strong Detachment of that Garison was marched from thence upon some Expedition towards Metz and Verdun.
