Prince Menzicoss is continued in the chief Command of the Muscovite Forces in these Parcs.

Palm, Fibr. 9. The 6th Instant an Order of King Stani-slams was published here, whereby all Subjects of this King-com are rorbid, under very severe Penalties, to go to the Council at Lemberg, or to give any Countenance or Af-fishance to those who, contrary to this Order, shall repair thisher.

Grates, Febr. 9. The Saxon Troops which were quartered here having been joined by those that lay at Tycozin, they are marching together towards Saxony. Upon their evacuating this Place, the Crown General put into it a Garison of his Troops, which are still here. We hear; that the Great

Council summoned to sit at Lemberg mer for the first time the 7th Instant. The Musicovite Troops continue their Marcht towards the Weissel, and the Cossacks commanded by General Czeremer, who are quartered in Vollinia, have also received Orders to march the same way.

Warsaw, Febr. 11. The 2d Instant 2000 Men of the Musicovite Troops came to Braagh, and our Magistrates were obliged to sumith them with Provisions. The 4th, upon a Report that a Body of Swedes and Polanders was marching sits vay, the Musicovites retired from Praagh, but being informed that this Report was groundless, they are since returned hither; and General Rheen, their Commander, has taken his Quarter in our Cassle, into which he has put a Garison. The remainder of the Body under his Command, which consists of about 20000 Foot, is expected here in a Day or two.

Vienna, Febr. 12. Prince Gaston of Tuscany and General Kirchbaum are lately arrived here from Italy. Letters from Presbourg give an Account, That the Imperial Forces commanded by General Staremberg, and those under the Commanded by General Rabutin, are joined; and that, by the last Advices, they lay between Toils and Altenbourg. The Malecontents in the mean time continue to make Excursions towards Presbourg and Rabb.

Hague, Febr. 22. N.S. Vesterday the, States General appointed Monsicur Renswoude to be one of their Deputies to relide at Brissles. Monsieur Vandenberg is also named by the Council of State to remain there on their part; and they are both preparing for their Journey thither. The two Ambassladors from the Republick of Venice to Her Majesty of Great Britain embarked yesterday Morning at Rotterdam, with their Reinne, on board Her Majesty's Yachis, and six Sall for England.
