**T**HE Troops which our Duke had engaged to furnish towards the intended Siege of the Castle of Milan, are marching thither with all expedition; and several large Boats are sent down the Po to Casal, to lade several Pieces of Cannon, and a great quantity of Ammunition, which are designed for that Service. His Royal Highness has given Orders for the perfecting with all Diligence the new Fortifications of this Place. He has erected the District of Rivoli into a Marquisate, and has conferred that Title upon General Thaur; and has also made him a present of Plate to a considerable Value, as an Acknowledgement of his great Services in the vigorous Defence of this Place during the late Siege: Our Magistrates have likewise presented that General with a Sword set with Diamonds. His Royal Highness has nominated Signior Visconti, Brother to Major General Visconti, to the Bishoprick of Verceil. The French seem to have laid aside the Thoughts of ever returning into these Parts, and to apply themselves to the securing of their own Frontiers; and for that purpose are fortifying several Places between Grenoble and Suza.

**Genoa, Febr. 13.** By a Vessel lately come in here from the Coast of Valentia we have Advice, That the Fleet of Men of War and Transport-ships, commanded by Sir Cloudesly Shovell, with the Land-Forces on Board under the Command of the Earl Rivers, are safely arrived at Alicant, to the great Satisfaction of the rest of the Confederate Troops in that Country; that his Excellency was landed with the said Forces; and that Directions had been given for the necessary Preparations to be made with all possible Expedition, in order to take the Field, so soon as the Troops are refreshed, and the Season will permit their entering upon Action.

**Milan, February 15.** The Garrison of our Castle began the 13th Instant, to cannonade the Town, and have fired about 300 Shot, most of them with red hot Bullets; however such Care is taken to prevent the Effect of them as much as is possible; that the Damage we have hitherto received is inconsiderable, and but two Persons have been killed. The Imperialists on the other hand have prepared 4 Batteries against the Castle, one of which began to fire the 13th, and has dismounted two of the Cannon which the Enemy had pointed against the Town, and obliged them to quit the great Tower, where several of their Men were killed by the Shot from that Battery; a second, which is erected within a few Paces of the Covered-way, was finish'd this Day; and the other two will be ready to fire very soon. More Artillery and Ammunition is sent for from Pavia, and other Places, it being resolved to carry on this Siege with all possible Vigour; and the weakness of the Garrison, with the want they are in of several Necessaries, give us Hopes it may soon be brought to a good Issue.

**Crasno, Feb. 12.** The 5th Instant a Body of the Polish Troops that are in the Interest of King Stanislaus, came into our Suburbs; but our Garrison, consisting of some Forces of the Crown, marched out against them, and obliged them to retire with the Loss of some of their Men. A Body of Muscovite Troops is since come into our Neighbourhood, and they oblige the Inhabitants of the Towns and Villages where they have taken Quarters, to furnish them with Provisions, and other Necessaries. The Revenues of this Bishoprick, which is now vacant, are applied to the paying our Garrison. They write from Lithuania, That the Forces of that Dutchy, which are commanded by Prince Wiefnowiski, have begun to assemble about Grodno, where that Prince is at present, who has summoned the Chief Officers under him to a Meeting, to be held there the 24th Instant. The Czar has sent to invite him to the great Council at Lemberg; but he has declined to be excused, alledging, That his Presence was absolutely necessary in Lithuania; and declaring, That he would concur in any Measures that should be taken in that Council, and that his Sincerity in their Interest might be depended on. The Swedish General Levenhaupt is gone to Riga, having left a Major-General to command in his Absence, the Swedish Forces in this Country, which are all quartered about Wilcomitz, on the Frontiers of Samogitia. General Ribba is arrived at Warsaw with a Detachment of his Troops,

and the remainder of them, to the Number of about 20000 Men, is come into the Neighbourhood of that City. General Czeremet is also marching that way with the Muscovite Troops that have wintered in Volhinia. The Czar has sent the Palatine Potocki with a considerable Sum of Money into Wallachia, to raise there a Body of 15000 Men. They write from Minsk in Samogitia, That the Sieur Smigielski, who has the chief Command of the Forces of that Province, came thither the 17th past, and on the 24th set out for Lemberg, with intent to assist at the great Council there. Letters from Zalkiow say, The Czar having received several Complaints of Disorders committed by his Troops, had established a Council of War, to consist of an equal number of Muscovite and Polish Generals, to enquire into and redress all Grievances of this nature; and that General Brandt was come thither to attend him.

**Vienna, Febr. 16.** General Staremberg returned hither the 13th Instant from Hungary, having left the Imperial Forces there, under the Command of Count Rabutin, in Quarters of Refreshment, between the Rivers Raab and Leitha. He has since waited upon the Emperor, to give him an Account of the Condition they are in; and having represented, that in so long a March, at this unseasonable time of the Year, they had lost many Horses, and wanted several other Necessaries, Orders are given for their being immediately supplied therewith. It was reported in Hungary when he came away, That Prince Ragozi was marching with the greatest part of his Forces towards Transylvania. Several Counties of Hungary, which lie on this side the Danube, have, since the Junction of the two Bodies of Imperial Troops commanded by the Generals Staremberg and Rabutin, quitted that Prince's Interest, and submitted to the Emperor. General Kirchbaum, who lately came from Italy, is made Governor of Landau, and is on his Departure thither.

**Frankfort, Febr. 24.** The Duke of Wirtemberg and General Thungen are gone to Heilbron, to assist at the Conferences of the Deputies of the four Circles, upon the Methods to be taken for bringing our Troops early into the Field this Campaign. The Troops of the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt have left their Winter-quarters, and are come into our Neighbourhood; those of the Circle of Franconia have also begun to move towards Neckars-Ulm, their general Rendezvous; and the rest of the Forces of the neighbouring Circles are also to march from their Winter-quarters, in order to take others more convenient for their drawing together in a short time, whenever there shall be occasion.

**Hague, March 1. N. S.** The Deputies of the several Colleges of the Admiralty, who were come hither to confer with those of the States General, are returned home, the Matters about which they came relating to our Naval Preparations for the next Summer being settled. They write from Brussels, That the Marquis de Weterlo is appointed General of the Horse in Brabant, and is going to raise 2 Regiments of Horse for the King of Spain's Service.

**Falmouth, February 17.** Yesterday came into this Port the Rising Sun of Middlebourg, Mercurius Armure Master, from Lisbon; the St. Peter of Stockholm, Martin Little Commander laden with Wine and Brandy; and the St. Peter of Bilbao, in Ballast, from Amsterdam, commanded by Ferdinando de Egaleda.

**Plimouth, Febr. 18.** Yesterday failed hence Her Majesty's Ships the Latcaster, Guernsey, Winchester and Child's Play, and under their Convoy about 40 Sail of Merchant Ships, bound for Ireland and the West-Indies. Last Night failed the Tryton for Ireland: At the same time came in two Dutch Ships from Nantz.

**Bristol, Febr. 15.** Yesterday put in here the Josiah of London, Joseph Blackman Commander, from India, but last from Corke.

**Dartmouth, Febr. 18.** On the 13th Instant put in here a Dutch Dogger from Bourdeaux, laden with Wine, and homeward bound. The 14th came into Torbay two Dutch Men of War from Portsmouth, being sent by Vice-Admiral Vandergoes, to convoy the Transport-ships bound from thence to Lisbon. Yesterday came in a Dutch Buss from Nantz, and a Dogger from Bourdeaux; both laden with Wine, and bound for Rotterdam.

**Portsmouth, Febr. 18.** The 13th Instant arrived at Spithead Her Majesty's Ships the Ruby and Beverham, with about 100 Sail of Merchant Ships and Coasters under their Convoy, from the Downes: At the same time passed by to the Westward Her Majesty's Ship the Norwich. The 16th in the afternoon Admiral Vandergoes put to Sea from St. Helens with his Squadron; as did also the Warspight, Switcure, Southampton, and about 150 Sail of Merchant-men and Coasters, the greatest part bound for Lisbon. Yesterday failed from Spithead to St. Helens Her Majesty's Ships the Anglesea, with the Leghorn Galley, and two other Merchant-men, bound to the Westward.
