Berlin, Feb. 19. N. S.

THE King of Prussia returned hither the 16th Instant in the Evening from Goltze, where he has been diverting himself with Hunting; and since his Majesty's Return, Orders have been given to all the Officers whose Regiments are in the Netherlands, to repair forthwith to their respective Commands. The King has sent Orders to Monsieur Printz, his Minister in Saxony, to wait upon King Stanislaus in his Quarters at Leisnitz, and there to take an Audience of him, and acknowledge him as King of Poland. Some Letters from thence say, King Augustus intended to remove with his Court from Lipsick to Dresden. They write from Poland, That the Party of the Nobility there who side with the Muscovites grows daily more formidable.

Stogard, Feb. 21. The Deputies of the Four neighbouring Circles, who are assembled at Heilbron, have resolved upon the sending a further Supply of Provisions and Ammunition to Landau and Philippsbourg, where the Garisons have lately been considerably reinforced, and those Places are so well provided with all Necessaries for their Defence, that we hope they are out of any Danger, if the Enemy should have a Design upon either of them. All possible Care is taken to have the Troops of the several Circles in a Readiness to take the Field early in the Spring.

Frankfort, Feb. 23 General Thungen has writ to the States of the neighbouring Circles, to press them to come to a speedy Resolution about the bringing their several Quota's into the Field as early as possible, in order to prevent the Enemy, who continue to make Preparations in Alsace for the next Campaign with great Diligence and Application: And in all Appearance these Instances, with those which have been made from other Hands to the said States, will have a good Effect; and we may hope to see the Imperial Army on the Rhine both more numerous and sooner in the Field than it has yet been during the present War. The Forces of the Prince of Hesse-Darmstadt are ordered to march to the Lines of Stolhoffen; to which several new Works are adding.

Paris, Feb. 25. N. S. The Ministers at this Court are frequently in Consultation upon the Measures to be taken, as well in relation to the Manner in which the respective Armies are to be employed the next Campaign, as for the providing of the necessary Funds for their Subsistence, concerning which several Proposals have been offered to Monsieur Camillard, but we do not hear that he has yet approved any of them. It is said, That 20 Battalions of Veteran Troops will be ordered from Alsace, to reinforce our Army in the Netherlands, and that a like Number of other Forces will be sent to Alsace in their room. The Gens d'Arms and other Troops of the Household, which are to serve in the Netherlands, will begin their March about a Fortnight hence. The Marshal de Noailles having resigned his Commission of Captain of the Guards du Corps, the King has given it to the Duke of Noailles his Son. They write from Lyons, That the Marshal de Telfe passed by there the 17th Instant, going to Grenoble, near which Place the Forces he is to command are to have their Rendezvous.

Falmouth, Feb. 22. The Queen Packet-Boat, John Culverdine Commander, failed hence the 20th Instant for Lisbon. The same Day the Catherine of Rotterdam, John Brown Commander, put into this Port, being laden with Wines, and homeward-bound from Bourdeaux, from whence she sailed the 15th. Yesterday the Dun-burgh of Amsterdam failed hence for

Guinea. This Day came in the Good Hope of Zurriczee, bound from thence to Bourdeaux, Cornelius Post Master, who reports, That he met yesterday to the Eastward of this Place 5-French Privateers, that boarded him, and took his Boat from him, with most of his Provisions.

Dartmouth, Feb. 21. On the 19th Instant came into Torbay Her Majesty's Ship the Southampton, being appointed one of the Convoys for the Welsh Trade; and with her 14 Sail of Coasters from the Eastward, bound for Plymouth and Falmouth, which put into this Port. The next Day 4 of them sailed again, and joined Her Majesty's Ship the Anglesea, bound for Plymouth; the rest are still here. Yesterday the Dispatch of London, Captain Fitz-Carter Commander, put to Sea, being bound to Alexandria, and the Samuel and Sarah of this Place, Captain Symons Commander, for Newfoundland. This Evening sailed the Langdon Frigate of this Place, Captain Arthur Holdsworth Commander, for Newfoundland.

Plymouth, Feb. 23. The 19th Instant came into this Port Her Majesty's Ships the Swiftsure and Warspight, with about 18 ourward-bound Merchant-Ships under their Convoy; a Coaster bound hither from London; and the Beake Galley of London, homeward-bound from Barcelona, which on the 4th Instant touched at Alicant, where Sir Cloudesly Shovell then was, with Her Majesty's Fleet and the Transports under his Command; the Troops which were on board them being all landed in very good Health. The 20th put in here 7 Dutch Ships, homeward-bound from France, and two Guernsey Privateers; and the 21st Her Majesty's Ship the Anglesea from Spithead, with 7 Merchant-men under her Convoy, bound to the Streights: She failed again this Day, together with Her Majesty's Ships the Nottingham, Assurance, and St. Alban's, having under their Convoy the 7 Merchant-men last mentioned, and another, bound likewise for the Streights. The Langdon Frigate of Dartmouth came in here this Day, and put to Sea again in the Evening, being bound for Newfoundland; as did likewise 6 Vessels that lately came from London, and are bound to Falmouth. Nine Dutch Ships and one Dane arrived here this Day from France, being laden with Wine and other Goods.

Portsmouth, Feb. 23. On Friday last failed out of the Harbour to Spithead Her Majesty's Ship the Rameles. The Sun Prize arrived yesterday at Spithead; and the same Day Her Majesty's Ship the Ruby failed into the Harbour.

Deale, Feb. 25. The Fleet Galley, - - - Fleet Commander, came down the River last Night, and failed through the Downes to the Westward, being bound for Leghorn.

The Dutch Mail of Friday last is not yet come in.

His Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark, &c.
