ETON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Eton Rural District Council Parish of Taplow (No. 7) Public Path Diversion Order, 1963

Notice is hereby given that on the 30th day of August 1963, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running northeastwards from the south-west corner of the Taplow Church of England Primary School Playing Field in the Parish of Taplow in the County of Buckingham to a line running northwestwards from the south-east corner of the said Playing Field to the stile on the eastern boundary of the said Playing Field. The old path will be closed as from 28th September 1963.

The Order becomes operative as from the 10th day of September 1963, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*Submission of Public Path Order**Hollingbourn Rural District (Leeds No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1963*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 5th day of September 1963, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way running from a point on the west side of Back Street, Leeds, immediately south of Seymour's Oast, in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 120 feet, to a line running from a point on the west side of Back Street, Leeds, approximately 70 feet south of Seymour's Oast, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 120 feet.
