Lisbon, March 12. N. S.

**S**IR Thomas Dilkes arrived here the 3d Instant from England, with a Fleet of Men of War and Merchant-Ships, having met with very bad Weather in his Passage. The 9th the Swiffture and Warpight, with several Merchant-men, arrived likewise from England; and a Fleet of Dutch Men of War and Merchant-ships came in the next Day from the Channel. Sir Thomas Dilkes is ready to join Sir Cloudsley Shovell, and several Transports, with six Victuallers for the Fleet, and a considerable Sum of Money to pay our Army in Valencia.

*Rome, Feb. 26.* Cardinal Rubini, a Nephew of Pope Alexander the Eighth, died here the 17th Instant, who had vacated a Sixth Vacancy in the College of Cardinals. Abbot Riviera, whom the Pope had sent to Prince Eugene, upon the Occasion of the Contributions demanded of the Ecclesiastical Territories by the Imperialists, is returned from Milan. The Senate of Venice having resolved, That their Ambassador should not comply with the Ceremonial lately established, and that any of the Cardinals, having Estates in the Venetian Territories, who should refuse to pay him the Visits, should forfeit such Estates, the Cardinals Ortoman and Pruli have chosen to visit his Excellency, rather than incur that Penalty; notwithstanding the Pope has confirmed the new Regulation, and has declared that he will insist upon it being observed.

*Paris, March 5.* The Duke of Mantua came hither lately from Padua, and intends to make some stay in this Place. The Imperialists have closely blocked up Mirandola, and continue the Blockade of Cremona. They write from Bologna, That Abbot Riviera, and Colonel Locarelli, the latter being sent by Prince Eugene, came thither lately from Milan; and having had some Conferences with Deputies appointed for that purpose by the Cardinals Legates of Bologna and Ferrara, and therein settled the Proportions of Provisions of several kinds, and other Necessaries, to be furnished by those Princes to the Imperialists, in lieu of the Contributions demanded, the Abbot continued his Journey to Rome, and the Colonel returned to Milan.

*Warsaw, March 1.* The Great Council of the Polish Nobility assembled at Lemberg, has agreed to confirm the Constitution entered into at Sendomir, and to issue our Circular Letters to the Diets of the several Palatinates to meet the 22d Instant, to choose Deputies for a General Diet to be held at Lublin in the beginning of May, where the present State of the Kingdom is to be considered, in order to come to a further Settlement; and in the mean time they have resolved to send Deputies to the Czar, to acquaint him with their Proceedings.

*Hague, March 18. N. S.* The States of Holland and West-Friesland met the 16th Instant. Deputies from the several Colleges of the Admiralty are come hither, to confer with those of the States General, upon our Naval Preparations for the next Summer. They write from Vienna, That the Malecontents have block'd up Leopoldstadt. Letters from Madrid by the Way of Paris say, That Prince Serclaes de Tilly marching to the Relief of Jaca, which Place was besieged by some Troops of his Catholick Majesty King Charles III. and the Militia of Arragon, they marched towards him, and obliged him to retire with considerable Loss.

*Falmouth, March 8.* On the 4th Instant sailed hence to the Eastward the Hopewell Sloop from Bermudas. The next Day put in here the Willing Mind Pink, Patrick William Master, and the Sandiford Frigate, Othaniel Barker Commander, both from Oporto, bound for London. They sailed from thence in company with 12 Sail more of Merchant-ships, and on the 24th part were separated from them by bad Weather. The 6th came in the William and John, William Smith Master, from Belfast, laden with Butter, and bound for St. Sebastian. This Day the Expedition Packet-Boat, Capt. Cleyes Commander, arrived here from Lisbon, having been 7 Days in her Passage. She brings an Account, That Her Majesty's Ships the Swiffture and Warpight arrived there the 27th past, which sailed from England with about 14 Victuallers and Merchant-men under their Convoy, and in the Latitude of 47 Degrees unfortunately fell in with a French Squadron of about 16 Sail, which took some few of the Merchant-men; but one laden with Maits, another with Accoutrements for the Portuguese Horse, and several more of the most valuable of the Fleet, got away, and arrived safe at Lisbon, with the Men of War.

*Hull, March 8.* On Wednesday the 5th Instant arrived here from London Her Majesty's Ships the Postillon and Rochester

Prize, with about 28 Sail of Merchant-men under their Convoy.

*Chester, March 8.* Colonel Whetham's Regiment arrived here the 5th Instant, and marched yesterday to Neston, in order to embark there for Ireland.

*Plymouth, March 9.* On the 5th Instant came into this Port the Hopewell from Bermudas, bound for London. The 6th arrived here the Hope from Oporto, and a Guernsey Privateer from cruising. Yesterday came in a Dane, bound for Nants, the London for Dublin and Genoa, and a Dutch Ship for Morlaix.

*Dartmouth, March 9.* On the 5th Instant came into our Range the Phoenix Sloop, Capt. Andrew Roach Commander, the Hooker Galley, Capt. Barker Tiller, the Ann Galley, Capt. Martin Culliford, the Eagle Galley, Capt. Street, all from Oporto, bound for London. They all sailed against the same Morning to the Eastward. At the same Time the Neptune Privateer, Capt. Henry Penny, homeward-bound from Oporto, sailed out of this Harbour into the Range; but the Wind proving contrary, they were all put back again. Yesterday came into this Port the Ginne Galley, a Pink, bound for London, Capt. Bolton Commander, from Lisbon, having been 9 Days in her Passage.

*Cowes, March 10.* The Maes Galley of Rotterdam, homeward-bound from Gibraltar, is come into this Port: The Master gives an Account, That he sailed from thence in the Company of another Dutch Ship of 20 Guns, from which having parted, he afterwards saw her off the Start Point engaged with a large French Ship. An English Galley, homeward-bound from Oporto, is also arrived here, which was taken by the French, and retaken by some Dutch Privateers off the Start. This Day the Concord, Peter Hamas, and the Nepruney, Cornelius Garret Commanders, both Privateers belonging to Middlebourg, brought in here as Prize a French Man of War of 54 Guns, and 343 Men, which they took the 4th Instant off of Scilly, after an Engagement of 3 Hours, wherein the French Ship had 60 Men killed, and several wounded: The Dutch Privateers had only 4 Men killed, and 16 wounded. This Prize is called the Bourbon of Brett, and came out from thence a Fortnight before in the Company of 15 other French Men of War, bound to the West-Indies.

*Portsmouth, March 11.* The 9th Instant in the Afternoon two Dutch Privateers, one of 20, the other of 30 Guns, brought into Spithead a French Man of War of 56 Guns they had taken off of the Lizard, after a warm Dispute, in which the French Ship had about 100 of Her Men killed: She is a new built Ship, and had not been above 3 Weeks off the Stocks. Her Majesty's Ship the Auguit arrived this morning at St. Helens, which gave chase yesterday on the back of the Isle of Wight to a French Privateer of about 30 Guns; but she being to the Windward, and having thrown all her Guns over board, to make the best of her way, the Auguit could not come up with her.

*Kennington, March 12.* A very dutiful and loyal Address of the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, of Her Majesty's Bermuda or Sommer Islands in America, congratulating Her Majesty upon the most Glorious and Happy Successes of the Arms of Her Majesty and Her Allies, and more especially of the Command of his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, has been presented to Her Majesty by Sir John Bennet, Sergeant at Law. Which Address Her Majesty received very graciously.
