INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6 Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following further amendments to the amended list published in the *London Gazette* on the 7th December 1962, as amended by notices published on the 22nd February 1963, the 22nd March 1963, the 6th September 1963, the 22nd October 1963, the 20th December 1963, and the 28th January 1964, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation Order, 1954.
